- Firewise USA NFPA program
- Volunteer framework, neighbors collaborate to reduce wildfire risk
- Non-profit FireSafe Councils promote through education, coaching
- Firewise USA Recognized communities:
 - lower risk for fire fighters
 - increase defensible space
 - focus on saving lives and homes

Evacuation Routes on county roads

 Improve tree/brush management, add more shaded fuel breaks, remove overhead canopy

• More Volunteer Fire Fighters

- Wildfire structure protection for our homes and communities
- Improved Emergency Notifications
 - Better accuracy (CodeRed)
- Fuel reduction on public lands
 - Adjacent to communities in high wildfire risk areas

FSCSCC Firewise Stats

- Jan 2021: 9 Firewise communities, 1200 homes
- April 7, 2022:
 - 26 Firewise USA recognized communities, 3027 homes
 - 16 more communities in progress, with roughly 600 more homes
- Total investments in 2021 for wildfire risk reduction (by those 26 communities):
 - \$2.7 Million
 - 48,924 hours
- 2021= First year for stats collection of this kind
 - NFPA tools issue impacted data for 8 sites
 - Newer communities less experienced with full reporting
 - Net: 2021 figures were likely under reported
